Moor House School has been educating children with speech, language and communication needs since 1947 and was the first school of its kind in the UK.

Moor House School is a co-educational, non-maintained, residential and day school specialising in the education of children and young people between the ages of 7 and 16 with speech, language and communication impairment.

From September 2012 our provision will include a Sixth Form College for students from 16-19.

Pioneering work in many areas of speech and language therapy and in teaching methods continues to place the school in the forefront of research, development and practice in the education of children with communication disorders.

As well as highly experienced teachers we have a team of specialist Speech & Language Therapists and Occupational Therapists, providing both integrated support within the curriculum and direct therapy intervention.

We have a strong belief in the value of the extended curriculum which enables children to use and develop their social skills and establish and maintain friendships.

The Moor House experience provides an environment specially designed to promote both academic and social learning. We aim to provide intervention which will produce independent young adults who leave school with a sense of achievement and self worth.
