Dear Parent/Carer

Re: Year 9 Diphtheria/Tetanus/Polio (DTP) final school booster and the Meningococcal ACWY (MenACWY) vaccination e-consent.

The Children and Family Health Surrey Immunisation team is visiting your child's school on **02.02.2024** to give the DTP and MenACWY vaccinations to year 9 students.

Diphtheria/Tetanus/Polio 3-in-1 final school booster protects against diphtheria, tetanus and polio. This vaccination will complete the baby injections given pre-school.

Meningococcal ACWY protects against the four strains of meningitis known as ACWY. These diseases are known to affect older adolescents, especially if they go to university or training where they are living in accommodation with other young people.

Necessary for the reasons of preventative or occupational medicine, for assessing the working capacity of the employee, medical diagnosis, the provision of health or social care or treatment or management of health or social care systems and services on the basis of Union or Member State law or a contract with a health professional.
