Uniform Reminder and Smart Watches

As we have begun the final term of this academic year, here is a reminder of our uniform expectations, as well as an update on students wearing smart watches in school.

Uniform

Uniform is an important part of a school's identity. It reinforces who we are as a community and helps to allow students to feel pride in their school. We expect students to follow the expectations and those which are sent out to parents when students join the school.

Here is a reminder of our uniform expectations:

- **Skirts** – standard black or grey skirt. To be worn no shorter than one inch above the knee.
- **Trousers and shorts** – black or grey, no jogging bottoms or casual shorts.
- **Polo shirts and shirts** – white polo shirts with the school logo or a white collared shirt with tie.
- **Socks** – black or white, which are shoe level and do not rise midway up the calf.
- **Shoes** – black, smart school shoes. Black canvas shoes or black trainer style shoes are permitted, as long as there is no visible logo or branding. We are aware of some students who are required to wear a certain shoe due to medical reasons and we therefore ask if this applies to your child you inform their tutor.
- **Coat or jacket** – to be worn only during unstructured times or when instruction is given.
- **Make-up, false eyelashes, nail varnish or jewellery** – must not be worn for school. Items of jewellery which are not in line with the policy will be confiscated. If ears are already pierced, only one small stud may be worn in each ear lobe. No other body-piercing is allowed, e.g. nose studs, tongue studs or other ear piercings. All studs should be removed for PE. Students will be asked to remove any makeup, false eyelashes, as well as false nails and nail varnish.
- **Hair** – no brightly-dyed/multi-tonal hair. Hair should be tied up where possible. Hair down is a senior award privilege at Key Stage 4.

Mobile Phones & Smart watches

Mobile phones, tablets and other electronic devices are to be handed in as soon as students arrive at school. This also includes smart watches. Smart watches are internet and camera enabled and therefore pose the same risks as mobile phones in terms of safeguarding. We have a duty of care to all of our students and it is of utmost importance that all students feel safe at Moor House. Students who are found to be carrying these electronic devices with them during the school day will have them confiscated.
